



TIM Team Spotlight: Region 10 — Macon

The Macon team kicked off its first meeting on Oct. 17, 2017 and has been going strong ever since. Macon Bibb Fire Chief Marvin Riggins and Bibb County Sheriff David Davis have been leading the team as co-champions since it's inception. Region 10 is made up of Pike, Lamar, Monroe, Jones, Bibb, Twiggs, Houston, Peach, Crawford and Upson counties. The Macon Regional TIM Team has had a total of eight meetings in the last two years with average meeting attendance of about thirty to forty area responders. The Macon team routinely discusses major road improvement projects in the area to stay up to date on detours, closures and construction that may impact first responders and the motoring public. The team also engages in quarterly incident debriefs and training exercises to facilitate working together as safely and efficiently as possible. The Macon team has demonstrated a strong commitment to the mission of TIME by continually showing up to meetings and prioritizing networking, training and sharing information prior to meeting up on an incident scene. Building relationships is critical so that everyone goes home safe at the end of the day. Keep up the good work Macon region!

Sandy Springs Plans for New Technology

As a member of the Georgia TIME Task Force, Sandy Springs is committed to arriving quickly to highway incidents so first responders can implement proper traffic incident management. This protects personnel on the scene and minimizes the time traffic flow is interrupted.

In order to achieve this commitment, Sandy Springs has invested in The Glance Priority and Preemption technology. As retired Marietta Fire Chief Jackie Gibbs says, "preemption gives emergency vehicles green to the scene."

Chief Gibbs implemented the Glance technology in Marietta and the fire department improved response times by as much as 1 minute to highway incidents. According to Applied Information other agencies have improved response times as much as 20%.

The preemptive technology changes the signal to green 30 seconds before the emergency vehicle enters the intersection. This allows traffic to clear the emergency unit's route so that responders arrive at their destination safely and sooner than they would without preemption.

Sandy Springs is in the process of installing the equipment on all traffic signals within the city. All fire apparatus, ambulances and law enforcement patrol units will be equipped with the technology by the end of 2020.


